

Guidelines for Baked Goods

- 1.
2. All baked goods should be taken to the Bake Stand Pavilion in the McAlisterville Park on either Friday or Saturday morning. Please tell the bake stand which church you represent.
3. Pies should be 9-inches in size and placed in **ZIP-LOC BAGS**. Do NOT use plastic wrap or foil. We will have plastic pie containers available at the park, too. Pies should be freshly baked, not frozen. Avoid pudding/cream or meringue-type pies. We cannot refrigerate pies. Use foil pie pans. We cannot return pie plates.
4. Bread – traditional shapes only!! (No bread machine shapes).
5. Whoopie pies should be wrapped individually in clear plastic wrap. Keep the size between 2 ½ to 3 inches for uniformity. We cannot accept whoopie pie cakes cut up into individual servings.
6. Apple dumplings should be on plates of 4.
7. **Label all baked items** (especially those with nuts, raisins, etc. . . in them).
